

Math 156 – Who’s Breaking the Law?

Here’s the law:

If you are driving in a school zone, your speed must be 30 km/h or less.

Here are four scenarios:

A: Jill is driving at 80 km/h down the Pat Bay highway.

B: Peter has just parked his car at Mayfair Mall.

C: Rich is driving at 50 km/h past Sir James Douglas elementary school.

D: Pat is driving at 30 km/h past Mount Doug high school.

Using logical symbols:

Let p = “You are driving in a school zone.”

Let q = “Your speed is 30 km/h or less.”

“If p , then q ” in logical symbols is written as $p \rightarrow q$, and its truth table is
